Gregorian Chant and Polyphony! What are they, and why are they especially suitable for use in the Mass? Gregorian Chant was developed to be performed by the human voice alone without the aid of instruments. It can be so simple that every word is sung on the same note, or quite elaborate with long sequences of different notes sung on a vowel in the middle of a word. Gregorian Chant is usually done with little or no harmony. Chant has its origins in the Jewish practice of chanting Psalms and other prayers on the Sabbath and other feast days. The early church continued this practice and adapted chant to its own liturgy as this developed. Different forms of chant developed in different places and the Eastern Rites of the Catholic church still retain their own forms of chant. Gregorian Chant takes its name from Pope Gregory I who, in the mid 800's, collected liturgical chants from as many different areas as he could. He compiled these chants, assigned particular chants to particular liturgies, and promulgated and standardized them for use throughout the Latin rite. Polyphony developed from Gregorian Chant in the 12th century. In polyphony multiple melodies are sung together and harmonize with each other. Polyphony is sublimely beautiful and many people, when they encounter it for the first time in the context of the Divine Liturgy, liken it to the angels singing. Gregorian Chant and Polyphony are especially fitted for Mass for several reasons. First, their words are taken directly from Scripture and the official prayers of the Church. Second, they are designed to be both solemn and beautiful. Their melodies help us quiet our hearts and minds and transcend our passions so that we can focus completely on Jesus and listen to what He is trying to tell us. Third, Gregorian Chant and Sacred Polyphony are totally different from the music that we encounter in secular culture. It is a reminder to us that the sanctuary of the church is a special place set apart for the worship of God. It is a place where heaven touches earth and where we receive our God and Savior into our very bodies in Holy Communion. Here Jesus pours out His very lifeblood to save us for our sins. Here He patiently waits, silent in the tabernacle, longing for us to come and give Him our hearts in return. This is ultimately what Gregorian Chant and Polyphony are designed to do, draw us to Jesus. Let us open our hearts and allow them to do their job!

¡Canto Gregoriano y Polifonía! ¿Qué son y por qué son especialmente adecuados para su uso en la Misa? El canto gregoriano fue desarrollado para ser interpretado únicamente por la voz humana sin la ayuda de instrumentos. Puede ser tan simple que cada palabra se cante con la misma nota, o bastante elaborado con largas secuencias de diferentes notas cantadas en una vocal en medio de una palabra. El canto gregoriano suele realizarse con poca o ninguna armonía. El canto tiene su origen en la práctica judía de cantar salmos y otras oraciones en sábado y otros días festivos. La iglesia primitiva continuó esta práctica y adaptó el canto a su propia liturgia a medida que ésta se desarrollaba. Se desarrollaron diferentes formas de canto en diferentes lugares y los ritos orientales de la iglesia católica aún conservan sus propias formas de canto. El canto gregoriano toma su nombre del Papa Gregorio I, quien, a mediados del siglo XIX, recopiló cantos litúrgicos de tantas áreas diferentes como pudo. Compiló estos cantos, asignó cantos particulares a liturgias particulares y los promulgó y estandarizó para su uso en todo el rito latino. La polifonía se desarrolló a partir del canto gregoriano en el siglo XII. En polifonía se cantan múltiples melodías juntas y armonizan entre sí. La polifonía es sublimemente hermosa y muchas personas, cuando la encuentran por primera vez en el contexto de la Divina Liturgia, la comparan con el canto de los ángeles. El canto gregoriano y la polifonía son especialmente adecuados para la misa por varias razones. Primero, sus palabras están tomadas directamente de las Escrituras y de las oraciones oficiales de la Iglesia. En segundo lugar, están diseñados para ser a la vez solemnes y hermosos. Sus melodías nos ayudan a calmar nuestros corazones y mentes y a trascender nuestras pasiones para que podamos concentrarnos completamente en Jesús y escuchar lo que Él está tratando de decirnos. En tercer lugar, el canto gregoriano y la polifonía sagrada son totalmente diferentes de la música que encontramos en la cultura secular. Es un recordatorio para nosotros de que el santuario de la iglesia es un lugar especial apartado para la adoración de Dios. Es un lugar donde el cielo toca la tierra y donde recibimos a nuestro Dios y Salvador en nuestros propios cuerpos en la Sagrada Comunión. Aquí Jesús derrama su sangre para salvarnos de nuestros pecados. Aquí Él espera pacientemente, en silencio en el tabernáculo, anhelando que vayamos y le demos nuestro corazón a cambio. En última instancia, esto es para lo que están diseñados el canto gregoriano y la polifonía: atraernos a Jesús. ¡Abramos nuestros corazones y permitámosles hacer su trabajo!
